What do you need?

- Paints (we used ArtWorks Poster Paints from **The Works** (https://www.theworks.co.uk))
- Zip lock bags
- Sellotape

What do you do?

1. Put two large blobs of different coloured paints inside the bag (ideally at far ends from one another)
